MISSION BAY LIBRARY

The first new San Francisco public library branch in 40 years recently opened just west of China Basin on 4th Street between Berry Street and the channel. 3RD STREET LIGHT RAIL

Public transportation is a key element to our neighborhood. In addition to the very convenient Cal Train Station (at 4th and King streets) there is now the extended 3rd Street line run by SF MUNI. The new portion of the 3rd Street line (the T-Third line) started running on weekends January 13, 2007. Full service will start on April 7, 2007. The T-Third Street links the southeast corner of San Francisco to the rest of the City. BERRY STREET BUILDING ADDITION CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

The construction on the Berry Street addition at China Basin Landing is proceeding smoothly and is approximately 33% complete. We are about to begin the major structural phase in March with the erection of the steal frame and closing in the exterior. As with all major construction projects, some disruptions and inconveniences are unavoidable. We have spent extensive time in the pre-construction phase planning to ensure the safety of our tenants and to minimize tenant disruption. During consturction, all building lobbies and the parking garage will remain open and fully accessible at all times.

First, we want to assure all tenants that we have engaged the best and most recognized companies in the industry, including our general contractor Hathaway Dinwiddie, and our architect, engineering and sound consulting teams. These experts have built and worked on some of the finest buildings in San Francisco and around the country. They understand and embrace our goal of maximizing safety and minimizing the disruption to our tenants. We have gone through an extensive planning and review process with the City of San Francisco, San Francisco Fire Department, State Fire Marshall, and a Peer Review team, and all work has been approved by the proper authorities.





We have worked with the City of San Francisco to schedule as much work outside of normal business hours as possible and have spent a considerable amount of time working nights and weekends to minimize tenant disruption. Our contractors have trained their crews on procedures for minimizing noise and have gone even further by selecting special tools and equipment to help reduce noise. We have worked closely with our tenants and, whenever possible, we have adjusted our schedule to work around tenant events and special meetings. The weekly Friday tenant coordination meetings have been very helpful in keeping interference to a minimum.

We are now five months into construction and the project is on schedule for shell completion in December. During this time we have carried out demolition work, relocations, installed connections and prepared the rooftop for the steel erection phase of this project. We have relocated some of the mechanical equipment off of the rooftop and have temporarily staged this equipment in the courtyard area. We have also gone through many stages of core drilling, concrete pouring and demolition across the rooftop area. The steel erection phase will commence during the second week of March. The steel erection will last approximately three months and will take place in several stages. The steel erection phase will be the most visible phase of the project, utilizing a large crane that will move along Berry Street. The erection process will only last a couple of weeks at each area before moving onto another location.

What this means to our tenants is that if the steel is being erected in your area it will only last for a couple of weeks.

Traffic on Berry Street will be affected as portions of the street will be reduced to one lane. There will be a flagman on the street directing traffic, including directing people to drop off areas, the parking garage and building lobbies. All building lobbies will be open at all times. The sidewalks areas and building entries will be protected and will also be kept opened at all times.

There are weekly construction meetings with our tenants on Friday mornings at 10am in the Hathaway Dinwiddie Construction office located in the breezeway, just off of the Lobby 5 entry
